


## Post-Desktop Uls?



- Journal Paper (~5-10 years)
- Conference Paper (~3-5 years)
  - Stick to reputable conferences (e.g., ACM, IEEE)
- Workshop Paper (~I year)
- Technical Report (caution: no peer review)

### Typical Review Template Logistics



- Rating of Expertise
- Statement of Contribution to HCI
- The Review:
  - Relevant previous work
  - Significance of contribution
  - Validity of work
  - Originality of Work
- Areas of Improvement
- Rating (1-5)
